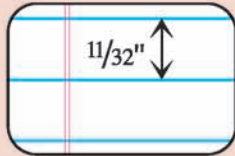
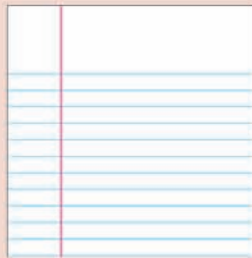




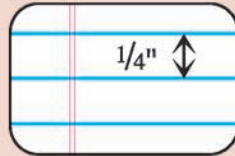
Legal (Wide) Ruled



Legal (Wide) Ruling

- Popular in business, K-12 school children, home and legal environments.
- Ideal for larger handwriting and ease of legibility.
- $1\frac{1}{32}$ " between lines.
- Letter size perf pad has 28 lines per page.

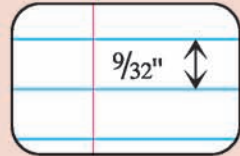
Legal/Narrow Ruled



Legal/Narrow Ruling

- Good for small size handwriting.
- Allows more writing per page.
- $\frac{1}{4}$ " between lines.
- Letter size perf pad has 39 lines per page.

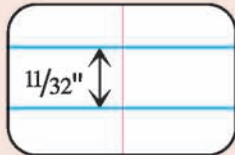
Medium or College Ruled



Medium or College Ruling

- Standard for college reports and term papers.
- Perfect for average size handwriting.
- $\frac{9}{32}$ " between lines.
- Letter size perf pad has 34 lines per page.

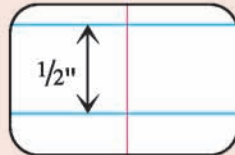
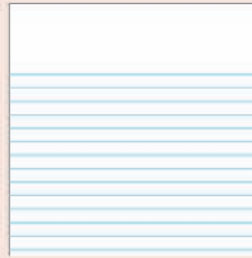
Law Ruled



Law Ruling

- Lawyers and others use to separate information on the left from that on the right.
- $1\frac{1}{32}$ " between lines.
- Single margin line 3" from left side of page.

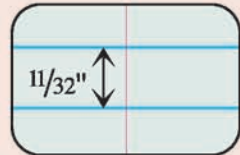
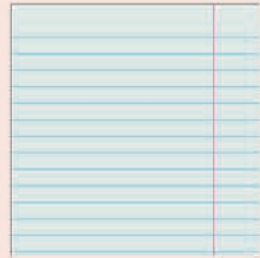
Pitman Ruled



Pitman Ruling

- Perfect steno ruling for larger handwriting, ease of legibility and those learning shorthand.
- $\frac{1}{2}$ " between lines.
- Single margin line down center of page.

Gregg Ruled



Gregg Ruling

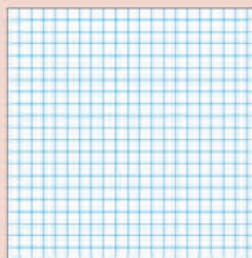
- Perfect for jotting down notes, taking dictation or writing quick memos
- Most common steno ruling for average/small handwriting.
- $1\frac{1}{32}$ " between lines.
- Single margin line down center of page.

Rules ARE Important!

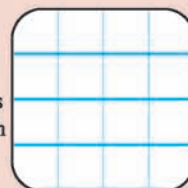
Everyone has a unique style of penmanship. Some write with a very large, bold scrawl, while others write with a very small, precise and delicate script. Many just can't write in a straight line!

Learning the rules will help you choose the right pad or notebook to suit your everyday needs!

Quad Ruled



4 x 4 squares per inch



Quad Ruling

- Ideal for engineers, architects and those responsible for precise technical writing and scale drawings.
- 4 x 4 (four squares per inch).
- 5 x 5 (five squares per inch).
- 6 x 6 (six squares per inch).
- 8 x 8 (eight squares per inch).
- 10 x 10 (ten squares per inch).
